What is Kerboodle?

Kerboodle is an online learning platform used by schools to provide students with digital textbooks, interactive resources, quizzes, and assignments. It supports a range of subjects and exam boards, making it easier for students to access their course materials anytime, anywhere.

At our school, students can use Kerboodle for:

- Science (OCR and AQA exam boards)
- Languages: French, German, and Spanish (AQA)
- Maths (AQA)


Kerboodle includes:

- Digital textbooks (same as the printed versions)
- Interactive activities and quizzes for revision
- Homework assignments set by teachers
- Self-marking tests to check understanding

This platform helps students study more effectively, whether at school or at home.

Accessing Kerboodle with Google


Go to www.kerboodle.com







Select "Log in with Google" (or "Sign in with Google"). Enter your child's school Google email and password. If prompted, allow Kerboodle to access the account (this is safe and school-approved).



If login fails, check:

- Is the email the correct school-provided Google account?
- Is the password correct? (Try logging into Google first to confirm.)
- If issues persist, contact your child's teacher.






Navigating the Platform

Once logged in, your child will see:


My Library:

Courses and textbooks students are enrolled into.



Courses:

Digital textbooks, videos, and quizzes for each subject. When you scroll down the main home (My Library on the top of the page) you will see all the courses that are available in Cotham School.








Dashboard:

Overview of subjects and recent work. This is viewable when you select a course in the My Library section. In this section you will be able to see the textbooks that are available to you (e.g. Foundation, Higher, etc) and get an overview of any set assignments.








Using Digital Textbooks & Resources


Digital Textbooks:

On the subject dashboard, clicking on the available textbook you wish to read will open a digital copy on your browser.










You can navigate through the textbooking using the toolbar below.




Some books may have an alternate toolbar. See below.






The annotation tool is a very useful feature in Kerboodle. It lets students highlight text, add notes, and bookmark pages directly in their digital textbooks. This helps them:

- Mark key concepts for revision or questions to ask teachers.
- Color-code topics (e.g. yellow = review, pink = important).

Annotations sync across devices, so notes are always accessible.








Resources:

The Resources section in the course Dashboard is where students access extra learning materials, such as videos, worksheets, quizzes, and interactive activities. These resources complement the digital textbooks and help reinforce key concepts.



Types of Resources Available

Students can choose from a variety of revision resources to help them with independent studies, homework and exam preparation:

- Interactive Activities & Quizzes
 - Self-marking quizzes to test knowledge.
 - Drag-and-drop exercises (e.g. labeling diagrams in Science).
 - Flashcards for revision.
- Worksheets & Downloadable PDFs
 - Printable worksheets for offline practice.
 - Answer sheets (sometimes provided separately for teachers).
- Videos & Animations
 - Short explainer videos for complex topics.
 - Animations (e.g. chemical reactions in Science, historical events in History).
- Audio Resources
 - Listening exercises (common in Languages).
 - Pronunciation guides.
- Exam Practice & Revision
 - o Past paper questions (for GCSE/A-Level subjects).
 - Model answers with examiner comments.






Checking Assignments & Progress

Assessment:

This is where teachers set tasks, and students submit their work.

Key Features

- List of Tasks Shows all assigned work with due dates.
- Submission Status Indicates if work is "Not Started," "In Progress," or "Submitted."
- Teacher Feedback Comments and grades appear here once marked.








Reports:

This area provides progress tracking and performance insights.

The Reports section provides valuable insights into your child's progress, including: Grades Overview (quiz/test scores), Teacher Feedback (personalised comments), and Progress Trends (performance over time). As a parent, you can support learning by reviewing reports regularly, discussing patterns in grades, and celebrating improvements to keep them motivated.








Next Steps:

The "Next Steps" box is a personalized to-do list that helps students stay organized. Here's what it includes:

Key Features

- Upcoming Assignments Deadlines for homework/tasks (with direct links to submit work).
- Teacher Recommendations Suggested activities (e.g. Complete Quiz 3.1 on Cells).
- Incomplete Work Reminders about started-but-unsubmitted tasks.
- Revision Prompts Links to resources (videos, quizzes) for upcoming tests.



Parent Tip!

Review your child's "Next Steps" together during study time to stay on track and break tasks into manageable chunks. Encourage your child to complete tasks on time and review feedback.



How to Support Your Child

- ✓ Encourage short, regular study sessions (15-20 mins) instead of last-minute cramming.
- ✔ Check the assignments list together to stay on top of deadlines.
- ✓ Use the "Next Steps" section to prioritise tasks.
- ✔ Review weekly reports and praise improvements to keep motivation high.
- ✓ Use quizzes, videos, and worksheets for extra practice in tricky subjects.

Troubleshooting & Parent FAQs

- ? I can't log in with Google?
 - → Make sure your child is using their school Google account (not a personal one).
 - → Try logging into Google first to check if the account works.
- ? Page not loading?
 - → Try a different browser (Chrome or Firefox work best).
 - → Clear browser cache or restart the device.
- ? Need more help?
 - → Contact your child's teacher for login or assignment issues.
 - → Visit Kerboodle Support for technical help.
