Bristol is a wonderful place to live. In fact it regularly appears in The Sunday Times's 'Best Places to Live' lists, often claiming the top spot in the region or even the UK. In 2019 Bristol was named the happiest city in Britain. It has also previously been named the best place to study, one of the top-five most inspiring cities, and even one of the top-ten cities in the world. It is a small city that feels like a big city, with the added benefit of fantastic countryside (including the Cotswolds) and beaches (Weston Super Mare and Burnham) on its doorstep. And - if you should want to head elsewhere - Bristol is well connected by rail, road and air to London, Cardiff, Birmingham, the rest of the country and abroad.

Bristol is also a fantastic city for families. There are plenty of parks and green spaces to discover and explore: the famous Downs, the Blaise Estate, Snuff Mills, Ashton Court, Leigh Woods, the list goes on. You can enjoy attractions such as the SS Great Britain, Brunel's Suspension Bridge, the Concorde Museum,

the M-Shed and We the Curious, take a ferry across the historic harbour, enjoy the world famous Balloon Fiesta, the Harbour Festival or spend the day at the Wild Place Project.

With a wide range of venues, there is an extraordinary variety of culture available: plays at the Bristol Old Vic or the Hippodrome, exhibitions at the Arnolfini, eclectic cinema viewing at the Watershed and the Everyman and concerts in St George's. Bristol is of course the home of Banksy, Wallace and Gromit, and bands such as Massive Attack, Portishead and Roni Size.

The entrepreneurial spirit is alive and well here, cultivating a host of independent shops - the Gloucester Road claims to be the UK's longest drag of independent outlets - restaurants, cafés and bars. In November 2019, Bristol was named 'Best Food or Beverage Destination of the Year' at the Food Trekking Awards and there are restaurants to suit all tastes and budgets, from Michelinstarred to street food. Try the shipping containers of Wapping Wharf, or visit the pop-up Breaking Bread on the Downs.

There are exceptional Universities in Bristol and also at least one excellent school too!



Why should you choose Cotham for your first or next career step? We offer a number of benefits that make us stand out from other schools and organisations.

Professional Development and career progression

At Cotham School we are committed to making new colleagues feel welcome and part of the school so that they can thrive and enjoy their job. We believe teacher development is important and, as such, we focus a lot on supporting teachers to improve their practice and develop their subject and curriculum knowledge. We offer a well-structured development programme for early career teachers, as well as opportunities for leadership development. We are proud of our tradition to grow our own staff and leaders; a significant number of middle and senior leaders started at Cotham School early on in their careers. We also ensure we invest time into developing and growing our support staff (at Cotham such staff are known as Associate Staff) as they are an integral part of our staff body. We offer a comprehensive induction and CPD process to all our new staff and many of our Associate Staff often take on new roles and responsibilities within the school as a result.





Staff retention is high and we recognise the talent of all our staff and want career opportunities for all

We have a strong tradition of subsidising and supporting appropriate academic studies, and offer a comprehensive staff development and training programme. We offer at least 5 INSET (training) days per annum with the provision of free onsite drinks and meals on those days. We have an excellent ongoing learning and development opportunities across different roles and access to a school CPD library.





Staff Wellbeing

Staff wellbeing is extremely important at Cotham School. We want to support staff to develop the skills and techniques to ensure good physical and mental health.

Balancing staff workload and ensuring high standards is a key to our success and our staff wellbeing committee meets regularly to discuss and plan activities to support all staff. We offer excellent work-life balance opportunities with term-time working arrangements. We welcome flexible working opportunities; approximately 24% of teachers and 55% of support staff are part time.

All staff have access to the staff wellbeing service ('LifeWorks Employee Assistance Programme) Plus SAS Health and Wellbeing support:


- Nurse Support Service providing nurse health support to the school. Wellbeing telephone support.
- **Cancer and Chronic illness support** plus additional complementary therapies can be made available.
- **Counselling and mindfulness** individual therapy sessions.
- **Physiotherapy** resources for staff to access. Staff have access to a telephone consultation and then development of a personalised plan. Onward referral to local clinic if additional intervention is required.
- Weight management service in consultation with slimming world.
- **SAS Gym** access to exercise programmes available on the SAS app.
- **GP Phone consultation 24/7** unlimited prescriptions can be provided if no examination is required and the prescription will be sent to a local pharmacy.
- Menopause support
- Flu vaccinations we offer all staff an annual free onsite flu vaccination
- Cycle to work we have an option to participate in the cycle to work scheme and encourage staff to cycle to work, with on site showers and changing facilities.

- **Physical health** we support staff physical health through Friday sports club
- Free eye tests We have access to gym and exercise schemes, plus free eye tests to our support staff

Other benefits of working at Cotham School include:-

- Competitive salaries which are reviewed annually
- Excellent defined benefit pension schemes (Local government or teachers pension scheme)
- On-site free car parking (when available)
