KS4 and KS5 Results for Summer 2023

This year, we saw a return to a full examination series and our students rose to the occasion with determination and maturity. This cohort of young people have faced unprecedented challenges to reach this point.

The majority of our Year 11 students were able to take their hard earned results and secure their place to study their chosen Level 3 courses with us at the North Bristol Post 16 Centre. The last 2 years have been incredibly challenging for all of us, but most of all for our students who have demonstrated incredible resilience in their approach to their studies. We know that a great deal of support has been offered by our parents and carers too and we're grateful to our parents and carers for that support. Well done Year 11 students and their parents and carers for achieving an incredible set of results.

We are especially proud of the resilience shown by our Post 16 leavers, who sat formal exams for the first time this summer, having missed the opportunity to sit their GCSEs in 2020 as a result of the global pandemic. The vast majority of our Post 16 students who applied to university were accepted into their first choice institutions, which will see them move far and wide to continue their educational journeys at some of the best universities in the country (and some travelling overseas for their higher education). We also saw a large number of our students secure highly competitive apprenticeship pathways in a range of industries. Once again, Cotham students made superb progress from their GCSE starting points, with almost a third of all A Levels graded at A or A*.

The greatest pride in these outcomes is in seeing our Year 11 and 13 students, who have challenged themselves throughout their educational journey and set high and healthy expectations, having those efforts rewarded. We share in their celebrations and wish them every possible success for the future as they step out to take their place in the world; we have no doubt that these results are just the opening chapter for the truly successful and substantial lives each one of them will go on to lead.
